Since 2011, Fringe! Queer Film & Arts Fest has been an entirely volunteer-run organisation rooted in East London's queer creative scene. Each November, and throughout the year, we showcase an eclectic mix of films, arts and events **celebrating queer stories and perspectives from around the world**, and welcoming everybody to celebrate with us across East London and our weekend festival hub, Hackney Showroom.

Our queer history is often erased or assimilated into the mainstream with our heroes' sexuality not acknowledged, so this year we have 7 documentaries and numerous shorts unearthing the **hidden/forgotten LGBTIQ+** histories, some of whom you may never even have heard of. Then, looking at the present day with hope and tenacity, we present and a strand of invigorating experiences of **global queer youth now** growing up around the world.

We also highlight the work of filmmaker **Catherine Gund** with three screenings and a masterclass that highlight the important documentary work and vital DIY films she's been making since the late '80s to further social justice, record queer lives, and bring activism behind the camera.

And of course it wouldn't be Fringe! without a healthy dose of the **sexy and provocative mixed with the weird and wonderful**. You will find this sprinkled across the programme to tease and please you throughout the festival

week.

As we continue to develop and our Fringe! family grows, some things stay the same: many of our events are free or affordable, we remain open to new voices and ideas, we all put our hearts into this as volunteers, and **we'll always be queer: celebratory but critical as hell**.

**FORBIDDEN GAMES:  
THE JUSTIN FASHANU STORY + Q&A**

The first black footballer to command a £1million transfer fee and the first openly gay professional player, Fashanu was a fearless trailblazer whose legacy has rarely been given the attention it deserves, despite the personal price he paid. *Forbidden Games* is a touching portrait which uncovers the complexity of Fashanu's life and struggles. At a time when British society was struck by intense racial and class division, life was never going to be easy for brothers Justin and John Fashanu, raised by a white foster family in Norfolk. In spite of this, they achieved great success in their respective footballing careers. Initially courting the limelight, Justin scaled the dizzying heights of fame and fortune early in his life only to have this eventually come crashing down. Painfully reminiscent of the similar demise of icons such as Amy Winehouse and Whitney Houston, both of whom have been immortalised in recent documentaries, Fashanu's story is one which exposes how society fails its idols. This important documentary attempts to redress the balance and understand Fashanu's life through interviews with friends and family, archive footage, and historical reenactments, to present a fresh perspective on this fallen star.

Centred on the politics of bodily fluids and viral pleasure, *Fluidø* is an immersive, visceral and vividly experiential cyberpunk feature oozing with delights from Berlin-based multimedia artist and filmmaker Shu Lea Cheang (*FRESH KILL*; *I.K.U.*). It's the year 2060 and a mutated version of the HIV virus re-codes bodily fluid as an erotic-narcotic. A new type of gender fluid human, *ZERO GEN*, are the bio-drug carriers of this intoxicating ejaculate. DIY biohackers, underground drug lords, and a scheming corporation are intermeshed when the (corrupt) government sends out secret agents to identify anyone who carries the mutated gene. But these android agents can also be 'turned' with a single shot of the exhilarant new drug...

*Fluidø* takes viewers on a sensorial journey through speculative sex and anarcho-queer futures, and we're thrilled to present this as our closing night feature. The screening will be followed by a Q&A with director Shu Lea Cheang. Then join us upstairs at the Genesis for fluids of another kind (alcoholic or not).
